
Introduction

Case study: the struggle of ageing bodies

Our bodies are wasting away and will one day die

2 Corinthians 4:16-5:5

¹⁶ So we do not lose heart. Though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day. ¹⁷ For this slight momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, ¹⁸ as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal. **5:1** For we know that if the tent that is our earthly home is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. ² For in this tent we groan, longing to put on our heavenly dwelling, ³ if indeed by putting it on we may not be found naked. ⁴ For while we are still in this tent, we groan, being burdened—not that we would be unclothed, but that we would be further clothed, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life. ⁵ He who has prepared us for this very thing is God, who has given us the Spirit as a guarantee.

1 Corinthians 15:42-43

⁴² So is it with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable; what is raised is imperishable. ⁴³ It is sown in dishonour; it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness; it is raised in power. ⁴⁴It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body."

-You hear from your brother that your mother is in hospital. She's had a stroke. They don't know whether she'll recover. You've not really ever considered life without her there. And how is she going to be cared for if she does recover?!

Discussion

Why can't they be like your friend's children who seem pretty nice and hard-working in comparison? You're concerned about how they're going to turn out.

- You're young by every standard but you're aware that time passes quickly. There is so much you want to do and be and you worry about it a lot.

- You have someone who is particularly dependent on you. You don't know how they will cope without you. You don't fear your own death or even getting older apart from how it will affect them. At times you feel consumed by anxiety about it.
