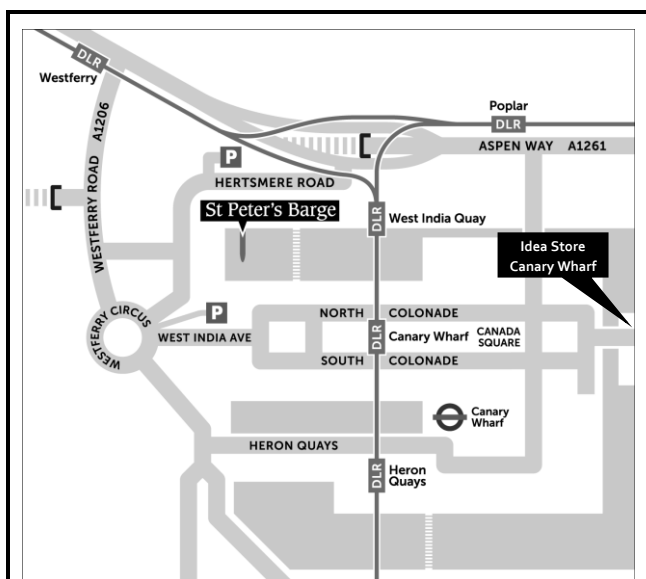

JOB

'Evil Monsters'

Job 40-41

- monsters under the bed

JUDGEMENT OF EVIL | it's ridiculous to think we could do it better than God (40:6-14)

- will you condemn God (v6-8)?
- can you do a better job as Judge (v9-14)?

BANALITY OF EVIL | Behemoth, the land monster, is very powerful but seems ordinary (40:15-24)

- the beast¹
- the banality

TERROR OF EVIL | Leviathan, the sea monster, is terrifying but God is sovereign (41:25-34)

- Leviathan symbolises evil ²
 - evil is under God's sovereign control (v1-7)
 - don't mess with evil, or with God (v8-11)³
 - don't underestimate the power of evil (v12-24)
 - don't fight evil in your own strength(v25-34)⁴
- get God and ourselves in perspective (42:1-6)
