

# Eyes on the Servant: Listening to the Right Voice

Isaiah 50:1-11

### Introduction: The exile was a terrible experience

• God's people were sent into exile because of their sins

50:1c '...Behold, for your iniquities you were sold, and for your transgressions your mother was sent away."

• Where will comfort come in the darkness of the exile?

## 1. Knowing the character of God's servant (50:4-9)

**a.** He obeys (v. 4b-5)

**b.** He suffers because he obeys (v. 6, 9)

**c.** His words are comforting (v. 4a, 7-9a)

### 2. Listening to the voice of God's servant (50:10-11)

**a.** Listening to the servant brings light (v. 10)

**b.** Disregarding the voice of the servant leads to ultimate ruin (v.11)

**Conclusion:** Listen to God's perfect servant and show your trust in the God who alone saves.

### Questions for discussion/reflection:

- Are there times in your life when you struggle to listen to Jesus, the perfect, obedient, suffering servant?
- Listening to Jesus shows our trust and reliance on God. Are there other voices you tend to listen to instead?
- Why do we find it easy to listen to other voices apart from Jesus?
- What are some practical ways you can listen to Jesus more closely in your daily life?
