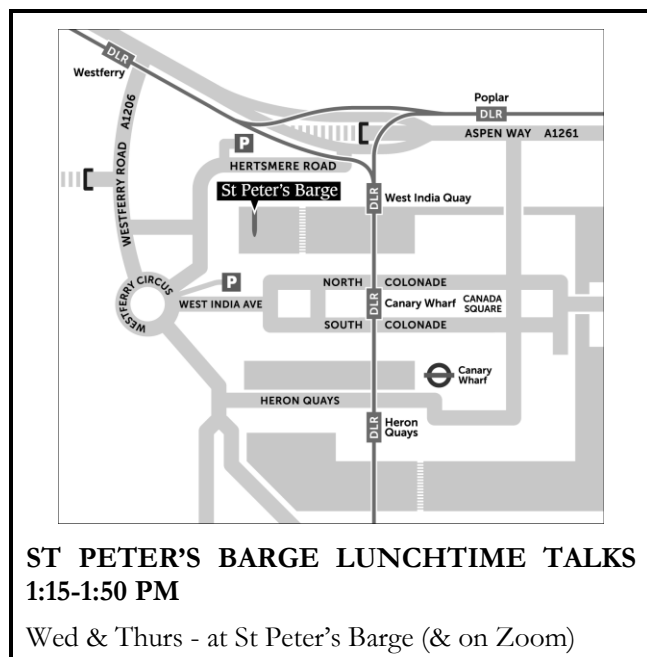

Eyes on the Servant: Listening to the Right Voice

Isaiah 50:1-11

Introduction: The exile was a terrible experience

- God's people were sent into exile because of their sins

50:1c *'...Behold, for your iniquities you were sold, and for your transgressions your mother was sent away.'*"

- *Where will comfort come in the darkness of the exile?*

1. Knowing the character of God's servant (50:4-9)

- a. He obeys (v. 4b-5)

- b. He suffers because he obeys (v. 6, 9)

- c. His words are comforting (v. 4a, 7-9a)

2. Listening to the voice of God's servant (50:10-11)

- a. Listening to the servant brings light (v. 10)

- b. Disregarding the voice of the servant leads to ultimate ruin (v.11)

Conclusion: Listen to God's perfect servant and show your trust in the God who alone saves.

Questions for discussion/reflection:

- *Are there times in your life when you struggle to listen to Jesus, the perfect, obedient, suffering servant?*
- *Listening to Jesus shows our trust and reliance on God. Are there other voices you tend to listen to instead?*
- *Why do we find it easy to listen to other voices apart from Jesus'?*
- *What are some practical ways you can listen to Jesus more closely in your daily life?*
